- Streamline and simplify administrative processes for parents, coaches and managers.
- Maximise financial value for members, while simultaneously maximizing fundraising opportunities for accelerated field and facility enhancement.
- Ensure good governance protocols are adopted and implemented as a community-based, not for profit community organization.
- Enhance two-way communication channels between the teams and the committee.
- Grow the engagement and sense of belonging of the BLFC community.
